Danielle Schmitz introduced NVTA's new Associate Planner, Jonathan Stanton. Additionally, Ms. Schmitz noted that Rebecca Schenck was promoted to Director of Transit.

6. STANDING AGENDA ITEMS

6.1 County Transportation Agency Report (Diana Meehan)

Diana Meehan noted the County Transportation Agencies would not be meeting until September 26, so there was no report.

6.2 Project Monitoring Funding Programs (Addrell Coleman)

Diana Meehan noted that moving forward Addrell Coleman would be sending the Project

Monitoring Spreadsheets to the TAC members prior to the meeting and if they have any questions, they may contact him directly.

6.3 Caltrans Report (Amani Meligy)

Amani Meligy reviewed the updates to the Caltrans report.

Danielle Schmitz added that Caltrans is aware of the big ruts and deterioration on SR 29 north of Yountville, between Madison and Yountville Rd., and is in the process of identifying a funding source to cover the repairs.

Rayner and Lederer expressed their appreciation to Ms. Meligy for the map and table, both noting that they are very helpful.

6.4 Vine Trail Update (Eric Janzen)

Eric Janzen reported that warranty walks on the St. Helena to Calistoga segment have been completed.

The park tread manufacturer has reviewed areas in need of repair and provided a quote, however, due to the high cost, the Napa Valley Vine Trail Coalition (NVVTC) is exploring alternative surface treatment options before authorizing the repairs.

The St. Helena to Yountville design team has identified an alternative for crossing Bale Slough and has presented it to Caltrans. The alternative includes a partial lane shift of the highway to make more room on the west side of the highway for the trail between the railroad and the highway.

Steve Lederer noted that the cost estimate for the St. Helena to Yountville segment is in the \$50 million range and the team is working to identify funding sources.

6.5 Measure T/Measure U Updates (Addrell Coleman)

Diana Meehan stated that semi-annual reports were due September 1 and reminded the jurisdictions to submit them if they have not already done so. Five of the six Measure U agreements have been executed; the last one is scheduled to go Napa city Council on September 16

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In October of 2023, the Napa Valley Transportation Authority (NVTA) Board of Directors adopted the NVTA Vision Zero Plan. The Plan identified and evaluated locations with higher rates of severe injuries and fatalities along the countywide roadway network based on collision records from 2015 through 2021, culminating in the identification of a Countywide High Injury Network (HIN). The Plan also evaluates risk factors associated with collisions that result in individuals being killed or severely injured (referred to as KSIs) and identified representative projects employing both engineering and programmatic countermeasures consistent with a Safe System Approach.

The Implementation, Evaluation, and Funding Strategies section of the Plan calls for regular updates and specifically identifies the value of a report card or similar data-driven approach to evaluating progress toward Plan goals.


Two years after adoption of the Plan, staff is seeking discussion and feedback from the NVTA Technical Advisory Committee on a proposed Vision Zero Biennial Progress Report.

BACKGROUND

As part of the Vision Zero Plan, an online <u>GIS-based Storymap</u> was developed to visualize Plan elements, and provide both jurisdiction staff and the public an easily accessible

platform to explore collision data, High Injury Network corridors, collision profiles, and related elements of the Plan.

Figure 1 – Screenshot from the Vision Zero Plan Storymap



Based on data from the UC Berkeley Transportation Injury Mapping System (TIMS), 178 fatal or severe injury collisions occurred in Napa County during the two-year period between January 1, 2020 and December 31, 2021, the final two years analyzed in the Vision Zero Plan. While a nearly identical number of collisions occurred in the subsequent two years (2022 through 2023), underlying details vary.

To continue providing accurate information regarding KSI collisions to the public, and support investments in safety projects that reflect both long-term trends and more recently available data such as NVTA's recently completed Michelin Mobility Intelligence safety study, a limited database update to the Vision Zero Plan is recommended.

The following reflects the preliminary outline of elements of the Plan that will be updated under the proposed Biennial Progress Report.

Completed Projects & Safety Investments - To demonstrate continued investments

- 1. Completed Projects & Safety Investments To demonstrate continued investments in safety consistent with the goals and strategies of the Plan, a list of completed projects that align with the Vision Zero Plan should be developed.
- 2. Data & Technology To ensure that future investments continue to align with the causes of severe injury and fatal collisions, update underlying crash data in the Storymap. Incorporate findings from NVTA's recently completed Michelin Mobility Intelligence (MMI) study.
- 3. Revision to High Injury Network Based on outcomes from data analysis, evaluate potential changes to the Countywide High Injury Network.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

NVTA staff will provide an overview of a proposed regional Transit Priority Policy for Roadways that is intended to support the implementation of transit priority projects in Napa County as well as the larger Bay Area. The Draft Transit Priority Policy for Roadways was taken to the Regional Network Management Committee in September of 2025 and the Metropolitan Transportation Commission is expected to adopt a Final Policy in December of 2025. This would mean that the Policy would apply to projects seeking more than \$250,000 of regional discretionary funds starting in 2027.

BACKGROUND


MTC is developing the Bay Area Transit Priority Policy for Roadways (Policy) to enhance the transit rider experience by supporting the implementation of transit priority infrastructure and policies that improve transit travel times and reliability and promote active interagency engagement necessary to be successful. The goals of the Policy are to:

- Improve transit travel times and reliability; and
- Help transit better serve people's needs and move more people in the Bay Area.

The purpose of the Policy is to promote stronger interagency coordination during project development, including more opportunities for transit agencies to provide feedback on

projects and ensure the needs of transit are considered. To streamline implementation, MTC is proposing to add additional transit priority elements to the existing MTC Complete Streets (CS) Checklist process. The Policy would apply to projects on roadways with scheduled public transit service (existing or planned).

The Policy would apply to roadway projects with scheduled public transit service (including detours and non-revenue) and would require transit agency review, not just transit agency acknowledgement. In addition, projects on key transit corridors (Transit Priority Network) would be required to *consider* transit-supportive design principles. The Transit Priority Network for Napa County and the greater Bay Area will be established in 2026. There will be an optional step where local jurisdictions can adopt a resolution of support of this regional Policy or update their local Complete Streets Resolution to include this new regional Policy.
