# 5.1 County Transportation Agency (CTA) Report (Danielle Schmitz)

- Provided an update on the Partnership Board Subcommittee on Connected Bay Area efforts to better link transit systems focusing operations in major Bay Area corridors to make it easier for riders, especially when using more than one system.

## 5.5 Measure T Update (Alberto Esqueda)

Report by Alberto Esqueda.

- The Independent Taxpayer Oversight Committee (ITOC) requested all jurisdictions use the same template for the Maintenance of Effort (MOE) certifications, preferably similar to the City of Napa's MOE certification. Staff will create a template and send it to the TAC for comment.

- The ITOC requested a revision to the 5-year project list so that it is easier to read. The SB 1 template was suggested as a potential model. Staff will modify the template and send it to the TAC for comment.

- The July 1, 2018 - December 31, 2019 progress report was due March 1, 2020.

- The next ITOC meeting is June 3; the City of Napa is scheduled to present their projects.

Member Whan requested clarification for listing projects on the project list that would allow the jurisdictions flexibility on project delivery, for example, including adjacent areas that may not be programmed in that same year when delivering projects. There are times when adding an area to a project is more cost effective.

Danielle Schmitz replied that the revised project list will allow flexibility in project funding and delivery.

Danielle Schmitz reviewed the proposed on-call planning contract setup which is similar to the Architect and Engineering contract and asked TAC members if they would be interested in participating in the contract and invited input on disciplines that they may need.

Several members indicated they were interested in participating in the contract.

7.2 Vine Transit Update (Rebecca Schenck) (Pages 29-32)

Rebecca Schenck provided operations performance statistics for the Vine local and regional routes, VineGo and the community shuttles covering the period of October-December 2019.

**7.3** Regional Transportation Plan 2050 (RTP) Napa County Target Budget Project List Approval (Danielle Schmitz) (Pages 33-40)

Danielle Schmitz thanked the Public Works staff who participated in the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Project List ad hoc committee. Ms. Schmitz noted that there is one change to the revised list that was included in the agenda packet - the City of Calistoga requested the Dunaweal Bypass project to be added back in at \$5 million during the outer years of the plan. NVTA's projects on lines 42 and 45 will be reduced by \$5 million. An aggregated list will be presented to the NVTA Board for approval.

The following changes were requested by TAC members:

City of Napa - Oxbow District Bicycle/Pedestrian Bridge, River Trail to Third Street (further to the east) - \$1.25 million, Bin 2, offset by the project on line 15, Salvador Avenue Complete Streets. The projects on lines 5, 9, 14, 16, 18, 21, 25, which involve highways, will be listed as NVTA projects

MOTION by WHAN, SECOND by TAGLIABOSCHI to RECOMMEND the NVTA Board approve the RTP 2050 Target Budget Project list with the following amendments:

Add the Dunaweal Bypass project (\$5 million) to the list, offset by reducing NVTA's projects #42, Enhance Regional Routes Frequency and #45, New Shelters and Stops Amenities (Expansion); Add Oxbow District Bicycle/Pedestrian Bridge, River Trail to Third Street (further to the east) -\$1.25 million, Bin 2, offset by the project on line 15, Salvador Avenue Complete Streets; Salvador Avenue Complete Streets, Line 15, change the notation of "Partial Local Funds" to \$1.25 million Local Streets and Roads, and change the \$100,00 in Committed Funding to \$100,000 in Local Funding;

Change the jurisdiction from City of American Canyon to NVTA for Line #5, Highway 29 Pedestrian Safety Overcrossings;

Change the jurisdiction from City of American Canyon to NVTA for Line #9, SR 29 Gateway Improvements Phase 2;

Change the jurisdiction from City of Napa to NVTA on Line #14, Lincoln Avenue at California Blvd and SR 29 Off-Ramp;

Change the jurisdiction from City of Napa to NVTA on Line #16, SR 29 over Trower Avenue; Change the jurisdiction from City of Napa to NVTA on Line #18, Widen Soscol Avenue-SR 221-SR 121;

Change the jurisdiction from City of Napa to NVTA on Line 21, Silverado Trail/Third

Street/Coombsville Road/East Avenue intersection improvements;

Change the jurisdiction from County of Napa to NVTA on Line 24, Silverado Trail intersection safety and operations improvements at Oak Knoll Avenue, Yountville Crossroad, Oakville Crossroad, Deer Park Road, Dunaweal Lane and Trancas/Monticello;

Change the jurisdiction from County of Napa to NVTA on Line 25, Route 221 corridor operations improvements.

Member Tagliaboschi reported the projects on lines #114 - South Veteran's Park Parking Improvements and #115 - Washington Park Sidewalk Project, have been completed and can be deleted from the list. Additionally, Line #117 - Future Parking Garage Facility, should be deleted as the Town of Yountville prohibits parking structures.

Motion was approved unanimously.
