Staff reviewed the purpose of the CASA Compact. The intent of the Compact is to create meaningful housing solutions for the Bay Area. It is a 15-year emergency policy package aimed at attacking the regional housing crisis head-on.

Member Heywood asked if there was any opposition. It was stated by staff that Marin was opposed at a commission level as they want to maintain greater local control over housing issues.

7.3 Travel Demand Management (TDM) (Kate Miller/Daneille Schmitz) (Pages 25-29)

Staff reviewed NVTA's effort to alter travel behavior in the County. NVTA will be launching its" V-Commute" initiative which includes the use of the RideAmigos application. The application will help facilitate ridesharing and incentivize people to take alternate forms of transportation. At a regional level NVTA is partnering with MTC to utilize the LUUM. LUUM is another mobile platforms targeted at large employers. It helps incentivize employees to use alternate forms of transportation.

Member Lynch asked what incentives are used to change travel behavior. Staff responded by saying that the two applications allow trips to be tracked and tabulated so users can win prizes.

Staff provided an update on the operational performance of the Vine for the first quarter of Fiscal Year 2018-19. Also provided was an update on the state of the Vine Vision service restructuring. The new service will be deployed in two phases. The first phase will restructure regional service starting in April 2019. The second phase will restructure the local service starting in July of 2019. The Board will approve the suggested changes and the schedule at their March 20 meeting.
